



**Pricing Supplement (from September 2025)**  
**for 3/4 year olds Claiming Extended Entitlement (up to 30 hours per week)**

Since 2010, the UK government has offered a Universal Entitlement for free early education and childcare, providing 15 hours of free childcare per week for all 3 to 4-year-olds. These initiatives are designed to support families by making early education more accessible and helping children get the best start in life. This free entitlement provision applies for 38 weeks per year only.

Eligible working families can benefit from the Extended Entitlement, which provides an extra 15 hours of free childcare per week, bringing the total to 30 hours. To qualify for the extended 30 hours, both parents must be working and earning at least the equivalent of 16 hours per week at the National Minimum Wage or National Living Wage, and neither parent should have an adjusted net income exceeding £100,000 per year. The free entitlement provision is to be applied for 38 weeks per year up to a maximum of 30 free hours per week. All hours of the day, 5 days a week, are eligible to be provided free of charge under the free entitlement provision with the exception of 8am to 10am every day. Therefore, a child attending for 4 or 5 full days (8am – 6pm) will be able to claim the full 30 hours free entitlement per week. A child attending 3 full days (8am – 6pm) will be able to claim 24 (8 x 3) hours free entitlement per week. Additional hours will be charged at the rates shown in the below tables. Furthermore, the free entitlement covers basic teaching provisions; however, it does not cover the cost of extras such as meals & snack and we thus charge for this separately. Please note that you are not obligated to take these extras as a condition to receive the free entitlement.

The invoices are broken down as follows:

1. Free entitlement per week for 38 weeks per year
2. Additional chargeable hours per week for 38 weeks per year
3. Meals & Snacks per week for 38 weeks per year
4. Full nursery fees for 10 remaining weeks per year

The total fees for the year are calculated as above, and then divided by 48 weeks to give a weekly cost (net of the free entitlement). This effective weekly rate is multiplied by 4.4 to give the monthly cost for all months except August and December. For August and December, the monthly cost is calculated by multiplying the weekly fees by 2. Thus, over the course of the year, the full annual fee (net of the free entitlement) is paid over the course of the 12 months.
